Directions to Joan Folwell's Home

- 1. Drive north out of Pullman on the Palouse highway (Route 27)
- 2. At the first intersection (AlbionRoad/Wheelan Road) turn right onto Whelan Road
- 3. Drive approximately 200 feet and immediately turn right on Kitzmiller Road (do not go past the McGregor Plant!).
- 4. The house is located 1.3 miles from the beginning of Kitzmiller on the right side of the road (look for the blue address on mailbox). Drive up the lane: the upper driveway leads to the front door and has three parking spaces and requires no stairs into the house; additional parking space is located on the lower drive and in front of the shed. Wear sturdy shoes for walking on the gravel driveway.

In a region where 14 tons of soil per acre can be lost to wind and water erosion each year when less sustainable farming methods are used, he is a leader. Website Update Paul Spencer

Google analytics is a service for web pages which is now installed on each page of our website. It collects information about the visits to a website for use in measuring user interest and to help decide how to improve the pages and the website as a whole. I thought League members might be interested in some of the information.

During the two months from January 20 to March 20, there were 137 visits and of these 96 were unique (that is, not the same person as a previous visitor). The visitors were from 41 different cities and towns all over the U.S. There were visitors from 10 countries outside the U.S. Including Turkey, India, Indonesia, Columbia, Brazil and Bulgaria!

Other than the opening page, the *About Us*, *Events*, and *Newsletter* were the most viewed. The *About Us* page had the second highest average viewing time of 2 minutes 35 seconds and the highest was the *Documents* page with an average viewing time of 6 minutes.

Observer Report

Whitman County Board of County Commissioners Meeting - March 22, 2012 Observer: Paul Spencer

The last several meetings have been primarily routine matters as is usually the case. One matter which concerns many LWV members is waste disposal, and the County has received bids for a new long haul waste disposal contract. The bids have been opened, and the county is negotiating with a different company than the previous hauler. The new contract was to have been signed in the last week. It is a 10 year contract with better rates than the previous contract, and a big advantage is that there is no provision for a surcharge based on the fluctuating fuel prices. It is expected that the new contract will save the county \$15-20 per ton for the long-haul waste.

The commissioners have received permission to hire outside legal counsel to help with the lawsuit against the county regarding the agreement the county made with the Hawkins Development near the Idaho State boundary line. The commissioners voted to approve the contract with Foster Pepper PLLC which sets the hourly rate at \$225 with a maximum allowable amount of \$10,000 without further action by the Board of Commissioners for good cause and prior approval of the court.

During a recent meeting Commission Chairman Greg Partch announced with emphasis to the audience that all the commission meetings including the board business workshops held in the conference room are open to the public except for occasional executive sessions for salary discussions or negotiations etc. Pullman LWV can take some credit for this because prior to our request and reminder to the BOCC of the provisions of the Washington State open meeting law, it seemed that much of the critical discussions and decisions were made in meetings not open to the public.
