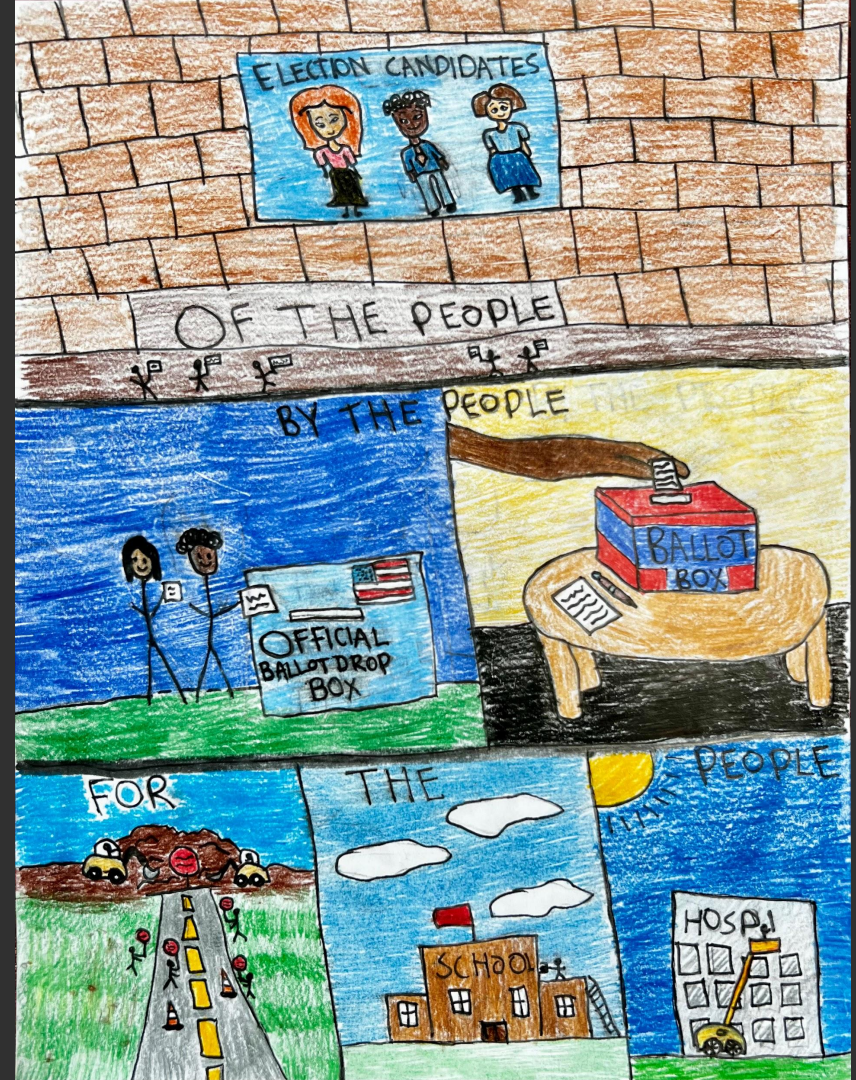

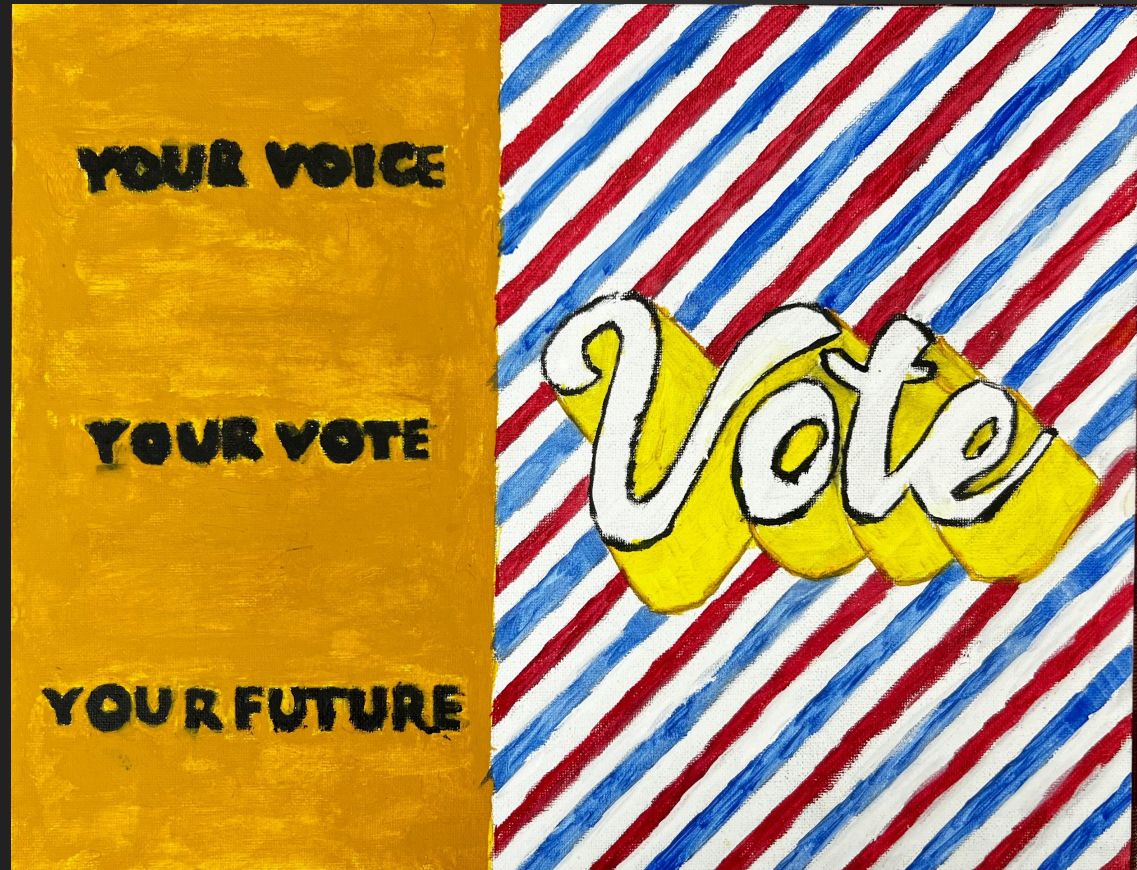

Kids & Teens should have the right to vote too

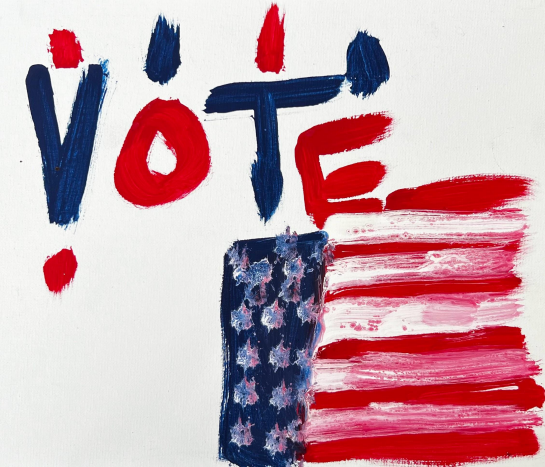

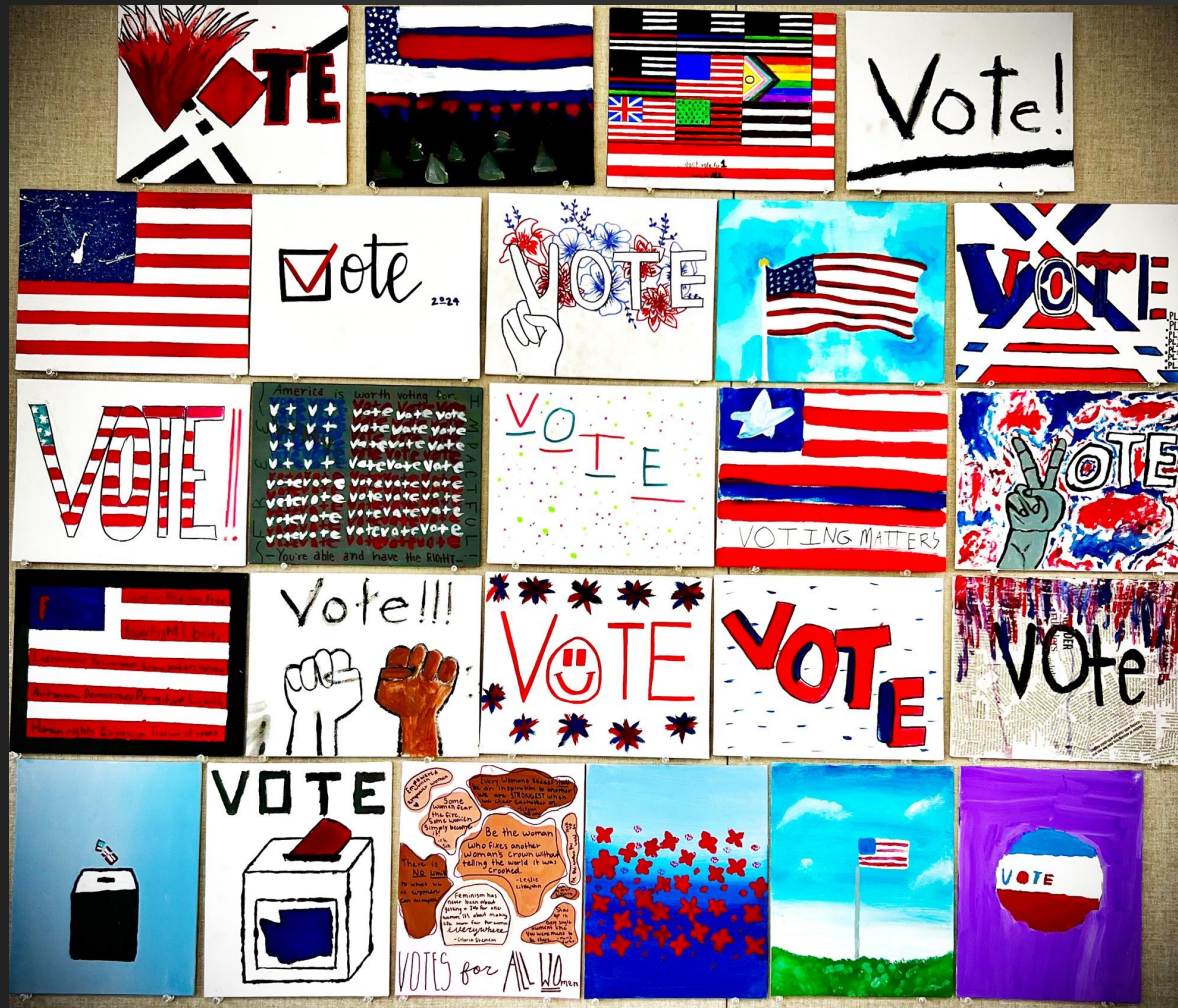
One Vote, One Step Forward
