## <u>Content</u>

Commissioners discussed some **self-evaluation** and knowledge questions.

Same Day Services expansion expects to open in April or May.

A **Pulmonologist and Sleep Medicine specialist**, Dr. Vinod Mehta, has come to the community and opened a clinic and will be having a lunchtime lecture on 1-29 at noon on sleep apnea at the hospital.

The hospital is continuing to see a slightly lower **in-patient admission rate**. (You may be surprised to hear that the typical number of inpatients daily is nine.)

No citizens attended the Public Hearing on the "**Quist Annexation Petition**". Before the meeting I asked for clarification of why the hospital was approving a land annexation and was told it has become a requirement for the Hospital Commissioners to approve any annexation of land to Public Hospital District No. 1-A. It was approved.

The **Quarterly Clinical Report** again showed positive outcomes in the areas of Medication Errors, Hospital Acquired Infections, Patient Restraint Utilization, Pain Management Satisfaction, Repeat C-sections, Blood Transfusion Reactions, Readmission Rates, and Swing Bed Utilization (allows patients to stay in hospital when not ready to be discharged).

Patient Experience Surveys showed high levels of satisfaction with both in and out-patient services.

**Financially**, November was reported to be a "good month", resulting in a YTD combined excess of revenue over expenses of \$1,060,970.

There was a report on milestones achieved since the establishment of the **Orthopaedic Center of Excellence**, established in 2015. Here are a few:

Decline in length of stay for total joint patients of 22%, for total knees by 55%.

Increase in orthopaedic case volume of 14%.

Gross charges for total knee procedures declined by 11%.

Regional High School Athletic Training Program established.
