## **Business pertaining to League Positions or topics of interest:**

## **Quality Instructional Programming:**

- Career and Technical Education (CTE)—Pullman High School Assistant Principal, Chris Franklin presented on all the CTE programs at both Lincoln Middle School and Pullman High School
  - Incredibly detailed report on how the programs are renewed frequently to be aligned with academic and industry standards
  - Number of students involved, and the range of classes offered
  - Why it would be difficult to start a Skills Center in our region b/c the center would only be able to
    offer programs that are not otherwise already available in the proposed participating districts
  - Yearly application for Perkins Grants which is federal money
  - Alignment and co-offerings with Walla Walla Community College, Spokane Falls CC, and Spokane CCs

## **Financial Stewardship:**

- Informative report on district's Risk Management
  - Insurance expenses have greatly increased in part because the addition of the new school but also coverage of the nine new buses
  - o Insurance agent negotiated a 4% decrease in the total bill which partially off-set the increase
- Transportation Cooperative paperwork approved
- Dropping out of the current sports league which costs \$500/year to join another league which costs ten times as much at \$5000/year in additional to an initial start-up cost of \$5,000 which is refundable if the district leaves the league
