- Clarkston and Walla Walla are suspending in-person classes at the secondary level

  - 3% of schools' outbreaks contained spread in schools and dropped to 2% when narrowed to primary schools only
  - Likely that the state guidance in response will loosen some; that will likely align to what Previous Public Health Director, Troy Henderson had recommended
- Themes
  - Need for transparency in communicating, agree on a specific metric, public health messages
  - o Minimize risk
  - o Provide flexibility
  - o Emotional and Mental Health
  - Survey of Teachers of K-2
    - Divided between now before Thanksgiving, first of the year
  - Start/holiday/start again awkward
  - o Community split
- Superintendent raised issue that knowing whether or not there are **enough subs** until they need them
- The Board voted 3 in favor and 2 opposed to setting the start date for in-person re-opening plan of January 4<sup>th</sup>, 2021. The meeting was adjourned.
