## Special Session on Re-opening plan

#### **Quality Instructional Programming:**

- In conversations with Pullman Transit for secondary students' transportation since the number of riders is limited
- Bus for elementary students is funded by ridership so if distance 2.0, there will be no funds for busing
- During spring had waiver to feed, "any child who was hungry" but that will not be the case for this coming school year
- Schweitzer Engineering offered to provide "staging equipment"
- ESD 101 through Skyward for checkout of equipment
- WSU has also reached out to offer support as well
