Business pertaining to League Positions or topics of interest:

Quality of Instruction:

- **Professional Learning Community initiative** over the next three years to make the process more effective and in-depth
- Meeting weekly with **State Department of Health and County Department of Health** about the metrics that are used to guide school district's decision-making
- State Law 5044 does not mention "Critical Race Theory", it is not the same thing as equity training which the district has been working on for years
 - District-wide book study on the same book that the administrators read last year "Belonging to a Culture of Dignity"
 - Public encouraged to check out the book if they are interested in what equity work the district is doing
- Assessment plan for up-coming school year
 - Approved
- Current collective bargaining agreement for school secretaries and custodial staff will roll-over except for implicit price deflater + 1% pay increase this year and next

Responsible Use of Public Funds:

- **Construction** just before the start of school is always interesting, but if last minute things are not done, we have a plan B
- Public hearing on 2021-2022 budget
 - No comments from public
 - Approved
- School Lunch prices for 2021-2022 school year approved
 - All meals are continuing free for all students as part of Federal Government's on-going summer program extension due to covid
- **Property purchase** for potential school site, approved in December 2020
 - o Additional negotiations regarding easement-Document of Sale now complete
 - Capital Projects fund reserve from prior elementary school project, not new money, nor is it money taken from the general district funding
- Policy 6970—Naming and Dedication of Schools and Mascots
 - More research
 - Continue to be a discussion item next meeting
 - o Board had said that they would revisit the request from the public to re-name **Jefferson**
 - Example Spokane Public Schools petition to change offensive name by young lady who is a tribal member
