Quality of Instruction:

- **Professional Learning Communities of teachers in the same building and area** (i.e., grade level or subject-matter) focusing on reaching all students with the **Tier 1 curriculum** so that all students can learn all aspects of the curriculum. Tier 2 and Tier 3 interventions support students who need more time to focus on the Tier 1 curriculum
- Three Jefferson ES teachers who are using the **new English Language Arts curriculum** shared about how it's going, the characteristics of the program and how students are responding to it

Responsible Use of Public Funds:

- PSD is part of the **state's Covid "test to stay" program** so rapid testing supplies have come from the state and the system's intent is to keep the most students in the classroom as possible.
- The District, at the guidance of Whitman County Public Health, had to suspend sports for two weeks, case counts at the time in Whitman County per 100,000 went in one week from 75 to 600

 Currently, there are 107 cases including all personnel and students
- **CARES funds** from the federal government in response to the pandemic allowed the district to more rapidly advance **upgrades in Wi-Fi** by two years
- Incident IQ, cloud-based tracking system for technology which was really important as the district transitioned back from on-line learning to in-person learning
- Target to build a more reliable network with a back-up tower
- 3971 Chromebooks in the system
 - Some of these can't be used for testing though
- Now district has more than one device per student which was really brought about by the pandemic
 - Middle and high school students have "take home" "bring back charged" on a daily basis
 - o Over the summer too but disabled
