## Quality of Instruction:

- On-going professional development on **Diversity Equity and Inclusion** continues with specific work in providing what the literature and trainers call a "guaranteed viable curriculum" for all students.
  - This involves ensuring that, based upon the standards within each discipline (e.g., Common Core math and language arts, and next generation science standards), professional learning communities of job-alike professionals such as each grade-level team at any given elementary school are at work designing curriculum that meets the learning needs of all students so that they can achieve benchmark performance in those disciplines

## Responsible Use of Public Funds:

- The **60** acres purchased as a future elementary/middle school campus is in the process of turning it to a lease property for continued farming until the time comes, indicated by space needs, to build.
  - This was for information purposes only, but if the amount anticipated to get the property ready for lease exceeds \$10,000, then it will have to go out to bid
- Due to new **Federal Transportation Authority (FTA) rules and regulations**, the Pullman School District (PSD) will have to **stop relying on Pullman Transit for transportation of students** who reside within the Pullman City Limits.
  - The city has requested of FTA that they renew PSDs contract for a year to provide the time to plan for the adjustment
  - o This will impact the number of buses, number of drivers, and start/end times for routes
  - o District is in the process of collecting data, and doing research to inform decisions
- Food Service director has been applying for state/federal grants to continue to develop the **scratch cooking offerings** at PSD schools
- LMS 6<sup>th</sup> grade ASB fees proposed to increase from \$20 per student per academic year to \$25 per student per year which would make it the same as the 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade ASB fees, due primarily to increased offerings in clubs for that grade level
- PHS increase in art class fees from \$20 to \$25 to cover increases in supply costs
