Business pertaining to League Positions or topics of interest:

Quality of Instruction:

- Social and Emotional Learning
 - Second Step Elementary
 - Look at <u>new instrument for evaluation</u> though (SAEBRS) principals are disappointed in the data (or lack there-of)
 - Middle School and High School programming will continue for one more year to implement better training for teachers
- Summer School
 - Nationwide shortage of teachers, teachers are exhausted from the pandemic, <u>PSD will likely not</u> be able to fill all the positions
 - High School summer school just started yesterday
 - o 27 students have returned interest in the **English Language Arts** 3rd and 4th grade sessions

Responsible Use of Public Funds:

- Annual Budget Presentation
 - o Budget is about 1.6 million in the negative, but there is a carryover fund balance of 4.1 million
 - Staffing is higher than our FTE indicates it should be in order to maintain smaller class sizes in response to learning loss due to Covid-19
 - Lost 192 FTE during the pandemic (2019-2021)
 - Down about 50 students from last year (majority of students lost during the pandemic returned)
 - Up 5 students for next year thus far
 - o 2.6 million over in budget for next year considering the carryover
- Although voters approved a certain **levy amount**, the actual rate is lower (e.g., levy request 5.3 million which translated to a projected rate of \$2.20 but an actual rate of \$2.05 in the end), that is a good thing
- All capital projects are finished except for the Pioneer center renovation
