Business pertaining to League Positions or topics of interest:

Quality of Instruction:

- Monday late start collaborative teams are creating common formative assessments (CFAs), this work has spilled over into other collaborative moments as can be grabbed time-permitting, teachers provide feedback to the Board about would love a little more time and a little more permission to work on what they want to work on
- 14 trainings offered by the district that are related to equity (at least roughly) throughout the year
- Policy 2411 High School Equivalency Certificate (HB 1686) approved
- Policy 3421 Addressing child abuse and neglect in students, clarifying requirements for mandatory reporting and definitions, approved
- **Board Operating Protocols**—empirical data supports that having protocols for the Board contributes to improved student performance
 - Delineation/clarification between Board, Superintendent, Leadership Team through the protocols is really important
- Recommendation to **delete temporary policies** that had been implemented during the pandemic with regard to certain graduation requirements which have now sunsetted
- Description of the **essential Principal roles and job duties** over which they are evaluated, local PSD district policy updated (8 standards for principals at TPEP evaluation on-line)

Responsible Use of Public Funds:

- **Class-action lawsuit against Juul company (vaping) was won** and some settlement monies will be coming to the District to spend on educational support.
- The District may join a new class-action suit against social media company for the negative impact on student mental health, more on this as more information becomes available
- **Bond refunding** which could reduce overall expenditures (2.9 million in savings at today's current rate, which has increased since the last Board presentation)
