- Sustainability committee
 - Has one PHS student member, would like to expand student participation
 - o PHS Students attended the Washington State sustainability summit
 - Probably through a CTE class or FFA since there is only one student on the committee
 - The students work and attendance is not related to the sustainability committee
 - Kamiak greenhouse plans, two years in the making, but should be installed by the end of May
 - o Committee has received several grants
 - Clean school bus grant not applied for by the committee, reflects the district's on-going purchase of electric buses which is now partially funded by the State per a new law passed in the 2024 session
 - By the fall of 2025, the district will have three electric buses
 - EV charging grant through Avista application turned in
 - WSDA farm grant, not applied for by the sustainability committee, a school cafeteria endeavor
 - \$20,000 for purchased farm produce within 100 miles of Pullman
 - Outdoor education school grant \$61,000 not applied for by the sustainability committee, something that has been on-going for over 30 years
 - Phoenix Conservancy—Monarch Grant for butterfly native pollinator habitat at PHS
 - Priorities of the committee:
 - Reducing food waste
 - Composting
 - Reducing packaging waste
 - Curriculum and coursework
 - CTE professional development considerations
 - Comprehensive plan for creating outdoor green spaces on school campuses
