Responsible Use of Public Funds:

- Good progress on the interlocal agreement (1993) and the Aquatic Center, additional meetings are scheduled
- Career and Technical Education (CTE)
 - District responds to comments from CTE teacher at a prior school board meeting that explains that someone is on a continuing contract (it has to be renewed each year, if it is on .8 with a one year .2 additional contract, that only lasts that one year)
 - CTE has to "live within its budget"
 - \$35,000 over-spent last year
 - Over \$200,000 over budget on salaries and benefits (very, very experienced CTE staff, so the state allocation doesn't cover the full salaries)
 - Meeting with CTE to find ways district can support more student interest in the CTE offerings
 - Home school students join CTE classes
 - In spring, CTE decrease b/c students are trying to make up credits
 - Cross crediting CTE with credit required classes
 - Track CTE budget more closely throughout the year
 - CTE supply costs have also greatly increased
 - Per student/per class funding through the state
